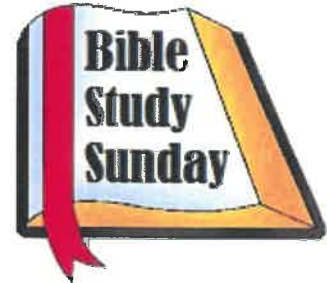

Last month I mentioned some of my “prayerful priorities” as the seasons of Stewardship, Thanksgiving, Advent, Christmas, and Epiphany roll out.

One of those priorities, building our **Endowment**, is mentioned elsewhere in this newsletter. I pray that Endowment Sunday will become a regular source of strength for our church.

A second priority is **evangelism**. But evangelism doesn't begin with preaching and witnessing. Instead, it begins with personal involvement and participation. Along with the Session, I'll be finding creative ways to encourage connections for every member. Not busy work—cherished relationships and service.

There was good news for another priority, as the Committee on Ministry of Presbytery approved our loan application for **solar power**. If the denomination also approves the loan, our Session will decide whether to move forward, which would mean congregational education and a congregational meeting. I'm excited about the possibilities, because the power produced would save us the same amount as we're paying on our monthly electric bills, which matches the projected loan payments.

A regular priority is **missions**. I've been in conversations with the Rev. Bill Lamont about a Friday/Saturday work mission together with Gulf Breeze Presbyterian Church at Dogwood Acres. The Mission Committee and Presbyterian Women will also lead us in several missions.

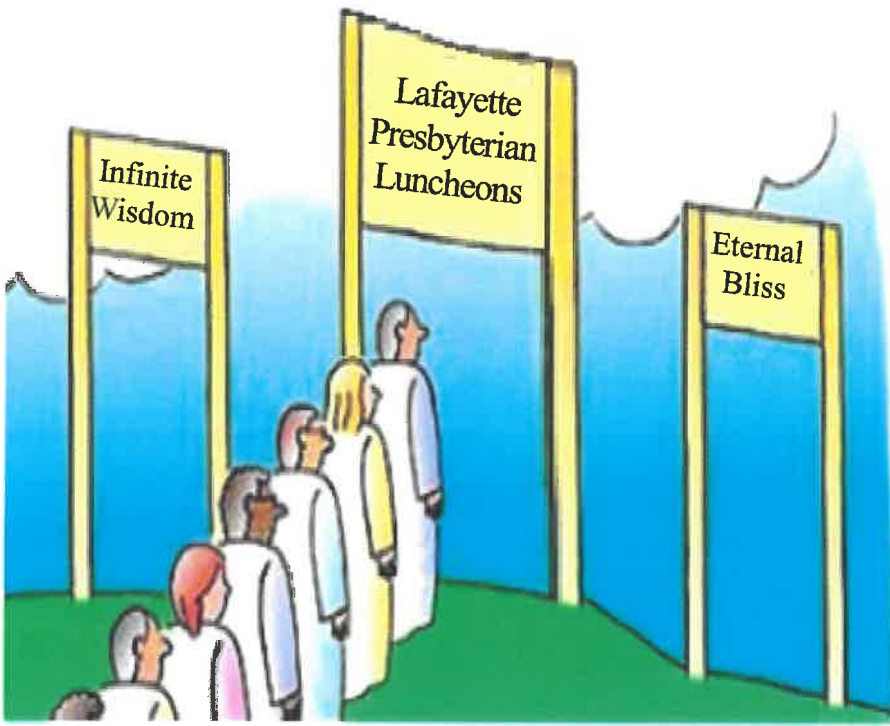
Collections for Operation Christmas Child have already begun and will continue until the boxes are delivered in late fall.

Presbytery Meeting Highlights

Panama City, August 23, 2022

- The Rev. Erin Rugh offered the message, “*I Am Your Neighbor*” during worship, and was latter examined and approved to join the staff at Faith Presbyterian as Associate Pastor for Youth and College Ministry.
- Elder Ben Powell is retiring as Director of Dogwood Acres due to health concerns, and he offered stirring closing words challenging us to welcome change as a means of building faith and discerning the Lord’s leading. He mentioned several people who were blessings to him in his faith journey, and the Rev. James Monroe was named prominently.
- Certified Educator Christy Williams will be the new Interim Director at Dogwood Acres.
- The Rev. Joyce Lieberman, retiring Executive for our Synod of South Atlantic, brought greetings and reminded us that the church of Jesus Christ is alive and well!
- Clark Simmons of the Board of Pensions reported that medical dues are going up, but that our denominational reserves are secure and sufficient.
- Presbytery Treasurer, Elder Denise Vandiver reported that Presbytery finances are holding their own, but that reserves have been tapped for cash flow. The per capita asking for 2023 will increase.
- The Rev. Brad Clayton noted that requested support from churches has been distributed so that local budgets and stewardship campaigns will have the information early this year.
- Elder and Stated Clerk Jeannie Dixon reported that there is now a website form for church necrology reports.
- The Committee on Ministry approved a “Restoring Creation” loan application from Lafayette Presbyterian.
- A loan application was approved for Trinity Presbyterian, Tallahassee.
- DiscipleFest 2022 workshops for Elders, Deacons, and other leaders will be Saturday, September 17, at Dogwood Acres.
- Elder Jeannie Dixon reported on General Assembly, noting in particular:
 - > The meeting was part zoom and part live.
 - > Gun violence was a primary topic, as were Ukraine, Israel, abortion, racial justice, gender identity, and immigration.
 - > The PCUSA voted to become a “sanctuary and accompaniment” church.
 - > Changes were made to statistical reports.
 - > Several new committees were formed.
 - > Guidelines for equity and inclusion, and for decision-making process were distributed to GA committees and might be useful at the local church level.
- The Rev. Brad Clayton was also a commissioner, and he said that the zoom sessions were isolating. He also reported:
 - > A Task Force was formed to rewrite the Standing Rules of General Assembly.
 - > A special committee was tasked with writing a new confession to propose to the next General Assembly.
 - > A Task Force will form a new non-geographic presbytery of Korean churches on the West Coast (of the United States.)
 - > A Task Force will explore the ordination and ministries for Ruling Elders.
 - > The Office of the GA and the Presbyterian Mission Agency will merge.
- Dr. Catherine Meeks spoke on racial justice and racial healing. She is the founding Executive Director of the Absalom Jones Episcopal Center for Racial Healing, a former Clara Carter Acree Distinguished Professor of Socio-Cultural Studies at Wesleyan College, and founding Executive Director of the Land Center for Community Engagement and Service. Dr. Meeks was a 2022 Presidential Award Lifetime Achievement Honoree. To quote Dr. Meeks: “*May I have the courage today to live the life that I would love, to postpone my dream no longer; but do at last what I came here for—and waste my heart on fear no more.*”

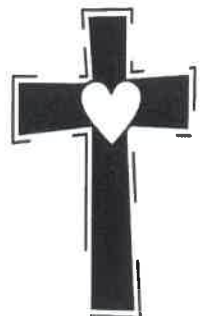

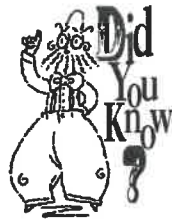

DID YOU KNOW? BY PHIL FERGUSON



A scribe was a high official in ancient Israel. After the Jews returned from exile, scribes formed groups to preserve the Scriptures. In the Middle Ages, before printing was invented, copies of the Bible were hard to find. Most of the scribes who copied the Bible were monks who were sometimes helped by nuns or occasionally lay workers.

Scribes did more than just copy scrolls: They made their own parchment from animal skins or papyrus and trimmed it to usable size. They also made their own pens from goose feathers or thin reeds which had to be continually sharpened. They made their own inks from vegetable gum and soot, for black ink, or vegetable gum and iron oxide, for red ink.

When a scribe had finished copying a scroll or book he would count all the words and letters and compare it with the original manuscript, sometimes comparing the middle word or middle letter in the scrolls, hoping to avoid any errors.

Our focus for the next few months will be the Operation Christmas Child Boxes. There are numerous items that we contribute to the boxes. We are always looking for new craft ideas too.

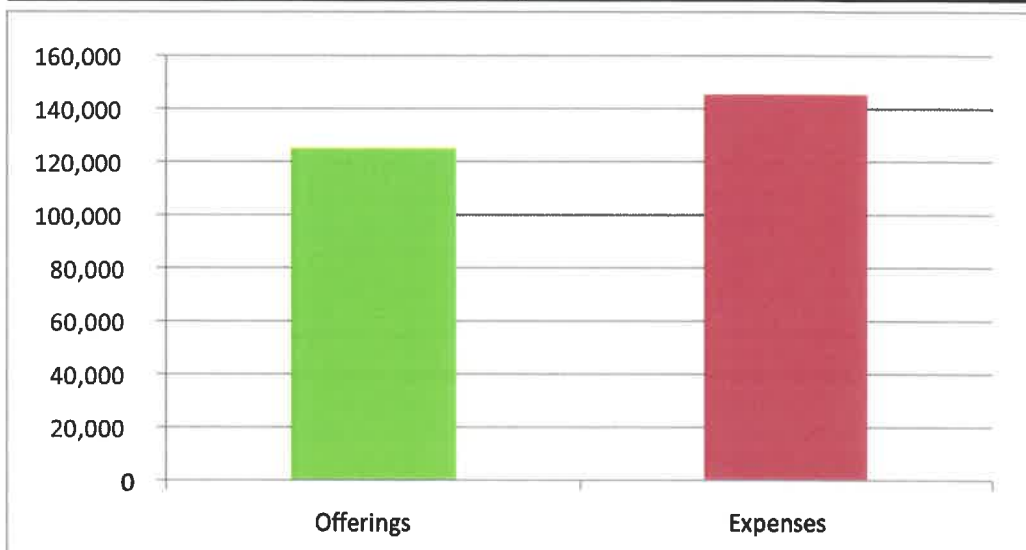
